Request:

The requestor contacted ASPR TRACIE and had specific questions pertaining to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Emergency Preparedness (EP) Rule. The requestor asked if the State ends their COVID-19 public health emergency declaration, will the Federal emergency declaration 1135 blanket waivers still apply.

Response:

The ASPR TRACIE Team reached out to Subject Matter Experts at the CMS Quality, Safety & Oversight Group (QSOG) for a response related to the requestor's requirement-specific questions. CMS provided the following response:

Since March 2020, CMS continues to issue 1135 waiver requests. Under Section 1135 or 1812(f) of the Social Security Act, CMS can issue several blanket waivers when there is a disaster or emergency. Blanket waivers prevent gaps in the access to care for beneficiaries affected by the emergency. When a blanket waiver is issued, providers do not have to apply for an individual waiver.
